23	(c) <u>Vacancies.--Vacancies shall be filled by the appointment</u>	94
24	<u>of a <u>successor</u> for a full term of four years. <u>No</u> appointed</u>	96
25	<u>member shall serve more than two full terms.</u>	
26	(d) <u>Meetings.--The council shall meet quarterly <u>and</u> at other</u>	98
27	<u>times at the <u>call</u> of the chairman. <u>The</u> executive director shall</u>	100
28	<u>call the first organizational meeting <u>of</u> the council and preside</u>	101
29	<u>until a chairman is elected.</u>	
30	(e) <u>Officers.--The council shall elect a chairman and vice</u>	102

1 chairman from among its membership at the first organizational 103
2 meeting to serve until January of the following year. 104
3 Thereafter, the council shall elect a chairman and vice chairman 106
4 from its membership at the first quarterly meeting in each
5 calendar year to serve one-year terms, and the chairman and vice 107
6 chairman may succeed themselves up to four successive terms. 108
7 (f) Quorum.--Thirteen voting members of the council shall 109
8 constitute a quorum. The affirmative votes of a majority of 111
9 appointed voting members present, but at least nine appointed 112
10 voting members, shall be required for the council to take 113
11 official action other than to adjourn or to meet to hear reports 114
12 or testimony.
13 (g) Reimbursement for expenses.--Members of the council 115
14 shall be reimbursed for expenses actually incurred in connection 116
15 with official duties. 117
16 (h) Offices.-- 118
17 (1) The executive director shall operate from the 120
18 offices of the bureau. 121
19 (2) The executive director shall direct and supervise 122
20 such clerical, technical and professional staff as may be 123
21 available for council purposes from the bureau within the 124
22 budget of the bureau. The compensation of such employees 125
23 shall be set by the bureau.
24 (3) The council may authorize and make appropriations 127
25 from the fund for staff.
26 (4) The executive director shall direct and supervise 128
27 such clerical, technical and professional staff that the 130
28 council may authorize and support by appropriations from the
29 fund. The compensation of such employees shall be set by the 131
30 council.

19	<u>(6)</u> Use the fund as a pass-through to pool investment	178
20	from the <u>Federal</u> Government, members of the council and other	179
21	<u>sources</u> earmarked for purchase of specific imagery,	180
22	<u>equipment</u> , services or other geospatial products.	181
23	<u>(7)</u> Charge up to 2% of pooled funds when received for	182
24	<u>pass-through</u> administrative fees.	183
25	<u>(8)</u> Deposit all administrative fees into a separate	184
26	account in the fund <u>to</u> support the administration and	185
27	expenses of the council.	
28	<u>(9)</u> Deposit with the State Treasurer such money in the	186
29	fund <u>not</u> currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund	187
30	<u>to</u> be invested in the same manner as other public money may	188

2	<u>(10)</u> Deposit into the fund all interest and other	190
3	proceeds <u>that</u> accrue from the investment of money in the fund	191
4	to be used for the <u>purposes</u> of the council.	192
5	<u>(11)</u> Prepare, publish and distribute an annual financial	193
6	report and <u>statement</u> of accounts showing the balance of the	194
7	fund and each account <u>within</u> the fund at the beginning of the	195
8	year, <u>appropriations</u> and contributions made <u>to</u> and the	197
9	expenditures from the fund <u>and</u> each of its accounts during	198
10	the year, interest earned and the <u>balance</u> of the fund and	199
11	each account at the end of the year.	
12	<u>(12)</u> Keep the financial records necessary <u>to</u> fully audit	201
13	the fund.	
14	<u>(13)</u> Disclose the financial records of the fund <u>to</u> the	203
15	Auditor General upon request.	
16	<u>(14)</u> Prepare, publish and distribute an annual report	204
17	summarizing <u>each</u> program supported by the fund, and any	205
18	grants, contracts or other <u>expenditures</u> from the fund broken	206
19	down by program, recipient and purpose.	
20	<u>(15)</u> Publish plans and procedures to guide <u>the</u>	208
21	allocation of the fund.	
22	<u>(16)</u> Create and administer a grant program from the fund	209
23	for <u>political</u> subdivisions or other members of the council to	210
24	<u>establish</u> and maintain interoperable geographic <u>information</u>	212
25	services and data.	
26	<u>(17)</u> Create and administer a grant program from the fund	213
27	for <u>private</u> firms and individuals to support development <u>and</u>	215
28	marketing of value-added geospatial products <u>using</u> data and	216
29	services supplied by members of the council.	
30	<u>(18)</u> Establish policies for licensing, <u>royalties</u> and	218

1	fees for value-added products developed <u>by</u> private industry	219
2	from data and services supplied by members <u>of</u> the council.	220
3	<u>(19)</u> Grant licenses and impose royalties and fees for	221
4	the <u>sale</u> and distribution by private firms of <u>value-added</u>	223
5	products developed from data and services <u>supplied</u> by members	224

7	<u>(20)</u> Deposit all royalties and fees from licensing	225
8	value-added <u>geospatial</u> products and services in the fund.	226
9	<u>(21)</u> Coordinate with institutions of higher education in	227
10	this <u>Commonwealth</u> to provide seminars to the council <u>and</u>	229
11	government, public and business <u>sectors</u> concerning emerging	230
12	opportunities for new <u>geographic</u> information products and	231
13	services for <u>possible</u> commercialization <u>by</u> Pennsylvania	233
14	industry.	
15	<u>(22)</u> Provide policy support, guidance and administrative	234
16	<u>oversight</u> to the executive director and council staff	235
17	employees.
